

Nakada Kannon: Chrysanthemum Matsuri

11/1 (Fri) - 11/10 (Sun)

Koan-ji Temple in Aizu Misato is part of Aizu's 33 Temple Pilgrimage and its Nakada Kannon statue built in 1279 is one of the Aizu Korori Kannon. It is said that offering chrysanthemum flowers at the Nakada Kannon can bring health and harmony. Noguchi Hideyo's Mother often visited to pray! November is Chrysanthemum season, and Koan-ji will be displaying them. The nearby Hoyoji Temple will be hosting it's Chrysanthemum Festival until Nov 5th and is also part of the 33 temple pilgrimage. Rich yellow leaves of a 30 meter tall ginko tree cover the grounds of Shingu Kumano Shrine and the Nagatoko (long floor) worship hall, a beautiful large open air wooden structure of 44 thick wooden pillars built in ancient Heian Era style. The grounds and tree are lit up in the evenings too! Experience the fall colours alongside ancient Japan.

Nihonmatsu City has taken the Chrysanthemum festival to the next level: creating stunning, colourful displays by covering dolls/mannequins with hundreds of flowers! The ruins of Nihonmatsu Castle, Kasumiga-jo, are the stage of these wonderful displays. Enjoy the flowers, the history and a beautiful view of autumn scenery from the Castle.

Stricter Cycling Laws from November

New stricter punishments for cyclists breaking the law. Please take note and take care!

Using a smartphone (including making phone calls) while cycling: Up to 6 months in prison, or 100,000 JPY fine

Causing a traffic accident, or hazard while cycling with smartphone: Up to 1 year in prison, or 300,000 JPY fine

For autumn Aizu's Seasonal Food is Aizu rice and sake! The Aizu basin is blessed with ideal conditions for growing rice. The temperature difference of the hot days and cool nights, morning mists in autumn, and deep snows in winter all contribute to delicious rice. Abundant fresh water from lake Inawashiro and the Aga river, and the water flowing from rich mountain forests full of nutrients add to the flavor.
