They had a lot of trouble going through the procedures at city hall, signing up for kindergarten etc., and he became acutely aware of the language barrier and institutional barrier that foreigners experience when they come to Japan. Struggling with Interpretation: Someone Help Meeee!

In January 2024, a family from Bangladesh moved into the house across from me: Mr Musa (who already

lived in Aizu Wakamatsu city and is a student at the University of Aizu), his wife, and his 4-year-old child. This move was especially difficult for them, because they moved from



a warm country in the middle of the harsh Aizu winter. His wife and child had just arrived in Japan and could not speak Japanese, so I took them around in my car. While driving, I told them "red, stop," "green, go," and "turn right," and a cute voice behind me repeated it for me. That's how I started teaching Japanese. When their 4-year-old child first uttered "Ojisan." I felt very happy.

I decided to help them prepare for daily life here. First, we went to the resident section at City Hall to register their residence cards. There, we received information about applying for child support benefits. Since you can't receive child support benefits unless your child is in nursery school or kindergarten, we looked into whether a nearby kindergarten would be able to accept the child. In the end, we chose Xaverio Gakuen, which emphasizes English. I was told to set-up bank account payments, but when I went to Toho



Bank, I found out that the family needed to apply in person (it would be difficult for me to apply on their behalf). The next day, when I took the husband there, I was told they needed to run a check of his status of residence etc. so

we had to go back to the bank again the next day. After

all that back and forth, we finally managed to complete the procedure.

After that, I received a call asking me to attend an information session about admission to kindergarten. I had thought that procedures so far had been quite difficult, but I then had to struggle to give this

explanation in my own clumsy English. "I'm at my absolute limit!! Someone please help meeee!" It was quite difficult with my



language ability (English proficiency 20%), so I struggled more than I thought I'd have to. It took some time, but somehow, we were able to complete the process. After that I was exhausted.

At every step of this process, from many people that I interacted with, I felt the words: "I can't speak English!" *What? Why?* Most people have studied English all the way through university, so they should have about 10 years of English experience. Even so, you can get by with just vocabulary! I thought Aizuwakamatsu City was an international tourist city? Let's all do our best to "Let's speak in English!"

Finally, I would like to say that Aizuwakamatsu City, where so many people from overseas are starting to live, needs more people who can interpret. And it's not just in English. If we don't do this, people coming from overseas won't be able to feel at ease. I think there should be more discussion about creating livable cities in the future.
