There are quite a few temples and shrines throughout Aizuwakamatsu, and in the summer, they hold small

festivals to pray for the health and safety of the neighbourhood. Some of these festivals have been bringing summer fun since the time of Aizu Lord, GAMO Ujisato in the 1500s. We can't write about all of them, but keep an eye out for ones happening in your area!

Shinto Rice Planting Festival

7/11 (Thu) - 7/13 (Sat) (Main event 7/12 (Fri))

One of the top 3 planting festivals in the country, this is the largest festival at the Isasumi Jinja Shrine. Designated as a National Important Intangible Folk Cultural Property, the rice planting ceremony here is considered culturally important. The events include a traditional dance by the farmer's eldest sons, and the highlight: a Shinto rice planting ceremony. This is definitely one to see!

Tajima Gionsaj

The largest festival Minamiaizu has to offer! At night, local children perform kabuki on moving yatai floats, but the highlight is the Nanahokai Procession (Bride 'parade.') The Tajima Gionsai is one of the top Gionsai in Japan and attracts visitors and photographers from all over the country. Women dress up in traditional bride clothing and walk in a parade down the main street of Tajima, carrying offerings to the shrine. All together,

more than 100 people participate. It's truly a wonderful sight.

Important Information

New Money Designs From July 3rd ~

Expect to see some new faces on the money! Starting July 3rd 2024, there are new designs for the ¥1000, ¥5000, ¥10,000 bills. The last time the design changed was in 2004. These changes come as Japan hopes to move more towards cashless transactions.

<u>¥1000</u> - **KITASATO Shibasaburo**, a bacteriologist and co-discoverer of the infectious agent of the bubonic plague etc.

¥5000 - TSUDA Umeko, the first Japanese woman to study abroad.

¥10,000 - SHIBUSAWA Eiichi, the father of capitalism in Japan.



Flat-amount Tax Break: June 2024

The Japanese Government is providing a flat-amount tax reduction for residents earning less than ¥18,050,000. Every resident paying residence tax will receive a ¥10,000 break. To facilitate this tax break, the Government did not collect residence tax from all eligible residents in June. Everyone will also receive an additional ¥30,000 break in income tax. The ¥30,000 income tax break will be applied to income tax from June 2024, until December 2024. Spouses and dependents are also eligible for the ¥30,000 income tax break, which can be applied to the working spouse's reduction. If you end up not having to pay the amount of your tax break in tax during the reduction period, you should receive a pay-out at the end of the year.
